	Have the group come up with definition of <i>Mystery</i> .

	Review some of the forced questions and ask for responses in reference to God
	The Mystery of God through the Trinity:
	Ask the group to give a definition of Trinity. Capture the results so that we can share each groups answers. My goal is for you not to influence their response just capture it then we will read page 56 - 57 in the guide.
	Talk about God's gender. Capture the responses and be ready to present on your findings.

Conclusions:	The central thing about the Trinity and God: God is not solitary, God exists as a communion of persons who perfectly communicate with one another and perfectly support one another.
If time permits:	Ask if the group can tell anything about Monotheism. Where did it come from? What happened to the many god's from the old time? Ask if anyone can tell us what they know about the Jews relationship with God over the years before Jesus.
