

Materials needed:	Copies of Handout 10 "The Human Person" for each student
Preparation work:	Review pages 40-47 of the CFH. Paragraphs 279-412, 1145-1147, and 1928-1949 of the Catechism. <i>Review paragraphs 1145-1147 of the Catechism</i> Review summary points in step 5 of this session. Ensure you have read and understand the two presentations of Creation! Gen 1:1-2:4, 2:5-25, 3:1-22 Psalm 24 and 104
<b>9:00 - 9:15</b>	<b>ATTENDANCE</b> Greeting, Prayer, review of the weeks events and overview of last weeks and today's session. Ask the students to share their perception of creation and discuss briefly.
<b>9:15 - 10:00</b>	The Human Person
Session:	Each table will have a paper with the following : "We believe that God speaks to us through creation" <b>DO NOT SHARE THIS AT THIS TIME</b>
	A: Share the following statements with your groups:
	S: "The Christian faith starts from the simple premise that we are creatures and God is our creator"
	S: "The Book of Genesis actually has two different Creation stories in it's first chapters"
	A: Take your group outside for 10 minutes. <b>NO TALKING HAVE THEM OBSERVE WHAT THEY SEE AND HEAR</b>
	A/Q: Ask the students what they saw, heard, touched, smelled, etc.
	A: Display the statement "We believe that God speaks to us through creation" at this time.
	A: Explain that this statement expresses a belief from the heart of Catholicism.
	A: Have the group discuss the following statement.
	Sample discussion points:
	When is this statement easiest to believe?
	When is this statement hardest to believe?
	What does this statement tell us about God's relationship to us?
	What does it tell us about our responsibility for creation?
	A: On three pieces of paper write the following, Cooperation, Lack of cooperation, ambiguous then ask the to put the following into a category:
	Situations, images, or events that illustrate human cooperation with God's creation and purpose
	Situations, images, or events that illustrate a lack of human cooperation with God's creation and purpose
	Situations, images, or events that are ambiguous, that is, the group members cannot decide.
	Conclude by sharing each groups finding with everyone.
<b>10:00 - 10:15</b>	
Conclusions:	Revisit the notion that creation is journeying toward completion and that God calls us to be coworkers .
